

EAST MILLINOCKET SCHOOL BOARD POLICY

CLASS STANDING POLICY

NEPN/NSBA CODE:

The policy for determining class standings at Schenck High School is established as follows:

1. All grades earned by the students in grades 9 – 12 will be reported in a numerical format.
2. The grades of students transferring to Schenck High School will be converted in accordance with the following scale:

3. All Pass (P) or Fail(F) courses shall not be included in the computation of class standing.
4. All courses, except support group and others with board approval, shall be included in computed class standing.
5. Summer school courses, correspondence courses, university level courses, private school courses, and adult education courses may be used in the computation of class standing as long as the principal has approved the course for inclusion prior to student credit for each three credit course.
6. A student may audit a course for one year and receive no credit upon the condition that the student enroll in the course the following year for credit and a grade. This option requires the prior approval of the principal.
7. Any student who voluntarily withdraws from a course after the first six weeks of class meetings will have the course included in their class standings using its cut off grade. Withdrawal from a course prior to the end of the first five weeks of class meetings will result in the grade not counting toward graduation or in the class standing.

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8. A student's class rank and the honor parts will be officially announced by the principal at the end of the third quarter of the senior year.
9. All students attending Schenck High School are included in the computation class standings.
10. All courses at Schenck High School will be weighed based upon the length of their meeting time as follows:
 - 1.0 A full year one credit course.
 - 0.50 A semester one-half credit course.
 - 0.25 A quarter year one-quarter credit course.
 - 1.25 A laboratory course meeting seven periods weekly all year.
11. Class standing is computed by multiplying each of the numerical grades earned by the factor based upon the length of the course. The number that is generated is then added with those derived from the other courses that have been attempted. The resulting total is then divided by the total number of classes attempted. The resulting numerical value is used to determine class standing. The largest value is ranking first and subsequent class rank is recorded in descending order.
12. Student participation in graduation exercises will be left to the discretion of the principal. The principal may consider extenuating circumstances when deciding whether or not a student may participate in the graduation exercises.
13. This policy will be implemented with the entering Freshman Class in 1996-97.
